Background

- BARI equity analysis identified an issue with 6th grade choice lists
- Many lists did not contain the guaranteed minimum number of quality schools

Simplified Choice List Generation

- 1. Two closest Tier I schools (straight-line distance)
- 2. Four closest Tier I & 2 schools (straight-line distance)
- 3. Six closest Tier I,2 & 3 schools (straight-line distance)
- 4. All schools that are within one mile from the student's home address (straight-line distance)
- 5. Three closest option schools (straight-line distance)
- Closest Early Education Center or Early Learning Center (straight-line distance)
- Any valid sibling school options, based on the school assignment of other siblings assigned to a BPS school
- 8. Add all citywide schools and corresponding regional schools
- 9. Adjust the list to show only schools that offer a grade appropriate program for the student.

Choice list analysis

BPS' comprehensive analysis of student choice lists for 2017-2018 registration determined;

- All choice lists met the minimum quality guarantee for students entering grades K2-5
- Not an issue for high school (citywide not HBAP)
- Lists for the following grades did not meet minimum quality guarantee as follows:
 - 6th grade 63%
 - 7th grade 18%
 - 8th grade 19%
 - o K1 7%

Update

- Initial list construction will follow the K2 method
- Added a check for minimum quality guarantee
- Schools will be added to choice lists to meet minimum quality guarantee
- Currently testing to ensure problem-free
- Implementation by November 17 (Showcase)

Impact on transportation

 Transportation for 6th grade students may require additional bus routes/buses at an anticipated cost of approximately \$500,000-\$750,000

 7th and 8th graders either have T passes or door-to-door transportation (costs should remain approximately the same)
