Before and After School: We provide daily programming at both campuses.

At Lower Campus, we offer a before school program from 7:30-8:15 AM (\$5.00 per day) and an after school program for students in K0 through Grade 2(3:10-5:30PM). At Upper Campus we offer a drop in before school program from 7:15-8:15 AM (\$5.00 per day) with homework help and a variety of daily activities. Seats are limited, so call 617-361-5555 to reserve a spot now.

Breakfast/Lunch Program: Breakfast and lunch will again be free for ALL students.

Dress Code: We do not have a school uniform. Students are expected to wear clothes that are clean, neat, fit and are appropriate for a school environment.

Medications: If your child has allergies, asthma, medications or other medical needs, please be sure to send in any needed medications or equipment with the doctor's orders so that we are able to support your child.

Parent Council: The first Parent Council meeting of the year will be on the first Tuesday of every month (September TBD) at 6:00pm in the Upper Campus library. Please come to learn about how you can participate in and improve your child's school!

Parent CORIs: We highly encourage and support parent engagement. However, parents who wish to volunteer in a classroom or chaperone a field trip MUST be CORI'd. CORIs are a criminal record check that will help to ensure that our students are safe at all times. CORI forms can be completed online at Boston Public School CORI/SORI Form.
